




## Membership

# TREASURER'S REPORT 2021-2022

Clean audit report ending the fiscal year with a surplus of \$8,104 and an accumulated surplus of \$652,824.

Accumulated Surplus to be used for future long-term needs of CAMA and for larger one-time Strategic Plan projects.

Revenues: \$18,000 more in Memberships; \$13,000 in Jobscene Broadcasts, \$15,000 in new Platinum Partnerships, \$12,000 in e-Brief Newsletter/Business Partner Program.

Expenditures: \$40,000 for Human Resources Toolkit, \$3,000 for Asset Inventory, \$17,000 more for translation, and \$5,000 more for IT/Website. Savings of \$18,645 on Board Meetings.

It is recommended that the Honourary Member for Life category be changed to a "voting" member.
