

ACCOMMODATIONS

While CAMA has successfully secured a negotiated Conference rate at the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel (the host hotel) and the Rimrock Hotel (the overflow hotel), we regret to inform you that both properties are currently fully booked. Detailed information about these hotels is available on the **CAMA website**. Please refer to the options listed below for alternative accommodations at various Banff lodging properties.

Banff Lodging Company

Banff Lodging Company is an employee owned and operated company in the heart of Banff. They have eleven properties located in the Banff National Park ranging from hotels to condos and suites, at separate price points. They do not offer room blocks, however we have negotiated a **20% discount** for all CAMA delegates at their properties subject to availability for the period of June 2-7, 2024. Rates fluctuate based on dynamic pricing and the discount will be applied to the rate at the time of booking.

All these hotels are located between 2.4 km and 5.5 km from the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel and are between \$350.00 to \$640.00 per night and are in a ROAM Transit service area (except for the Rocky Mountain Resort which is outside the Town boundary).

Banff Lodging Deposit and Cancellation Policy

- **Deposit.** There is no deposit required when booking with any of the Banff Lodging hotels. All you need is a credit card on file as a guarantee on the room.
- Cancellation Policy. Free of charge cancellations are offered up until 72 hours before you're due to check in. If you cancel within 72 hours (or don't show up) than you will be charged the cancellation fee which is the total of the first night of your stay, plus tax.

TRANSPORTATION

Delegates are responsible for their own transportation from airports to the Fairmont Banff Springs via rental cars or shuttle services. Below are some options from the Calgary Airport to the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel:





Receive a 20% discount on the Banff Airporter's daily shuttle service between the Calgary Airport and Banff. This code is valid for travel between May 30 and June 9, 2024.

Click Banff Airporter and then Book Now. Proceed through the reservation and type - CAMA2024 - in the "Promo Code?" section on the final payment page to receive the discount. **The discount code works up to two weeks before the event starts.** To guarantee availability, make a reservation at least a month prior to travel.

Remember Your National Park Pass: Essential for Your Journey

Ensure you have your National Park Pass before embarking on your journey to Banff. If you're renting a vehicle, the pass is a necessity and can be conveniently obtained online. Avoid the line ups and purchase the pass through the provided link, remember to display it on your rearview mirror, and you can use the bypass lane enroute. Alternatively, you can purchase a pass in person at the Banff National Park gate. The pass costs \$22.00 per day, or you may opt for an Annual Discovery Pass, valid at 80 Parks Canada destinations. 


TOURISM INFORMATION

What Should You Wear/Bring?



- You can wear sunglasses/glasses if these are secured with a strap or piece of string, and contact lenses are usually okay if you are comfortable swimming with them.
- Sunscreen is great on a hot day for any areas not covered by the wetsuit but avoid putting it above or near your eyes.
- You can bring your own waterproof camera or GoPro which can be secured with your own chest harness or on a helmet with a GoPro mount, but Discover Banff Tours is not responsible for loss or damage of your equipment.




