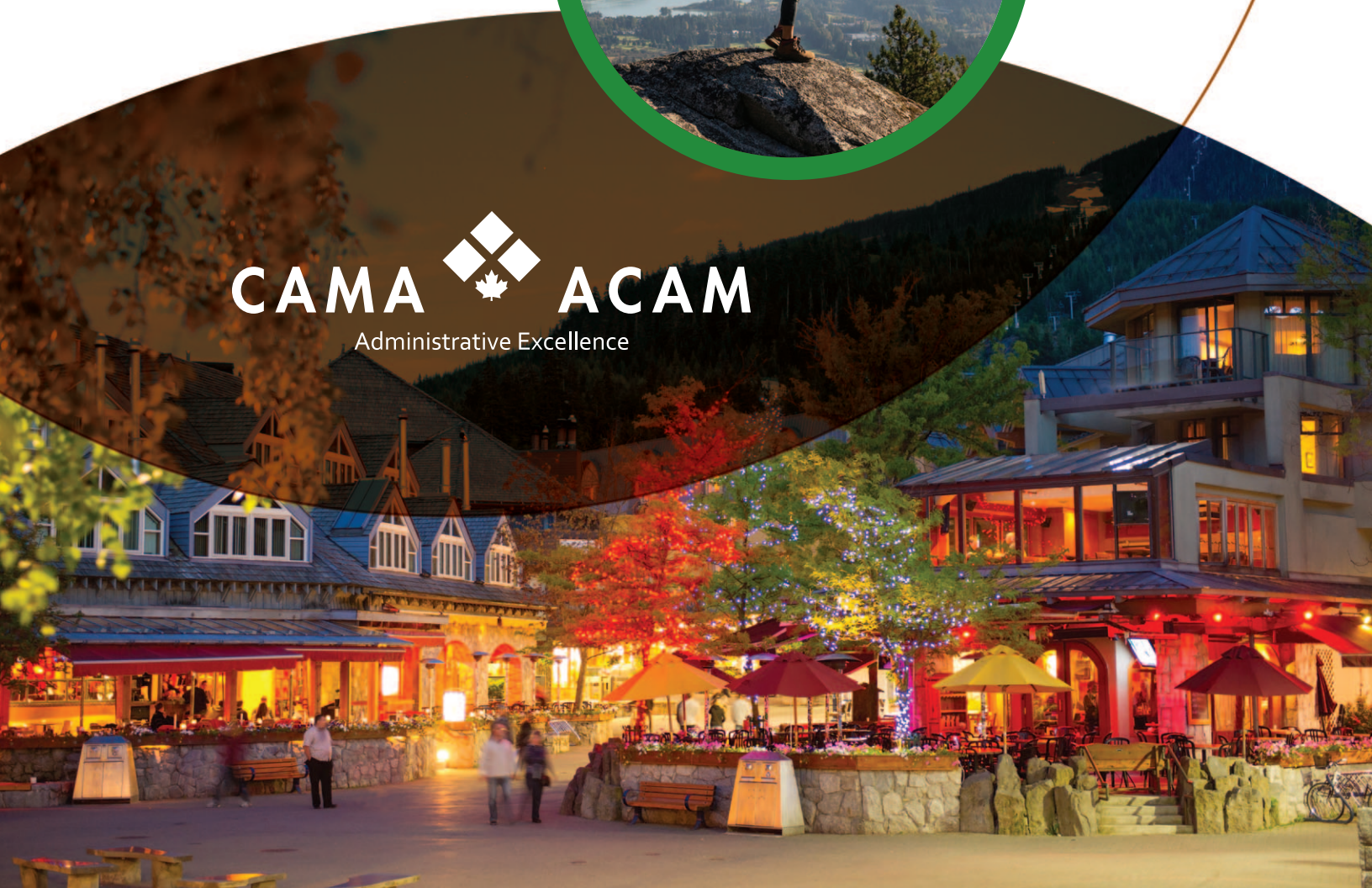

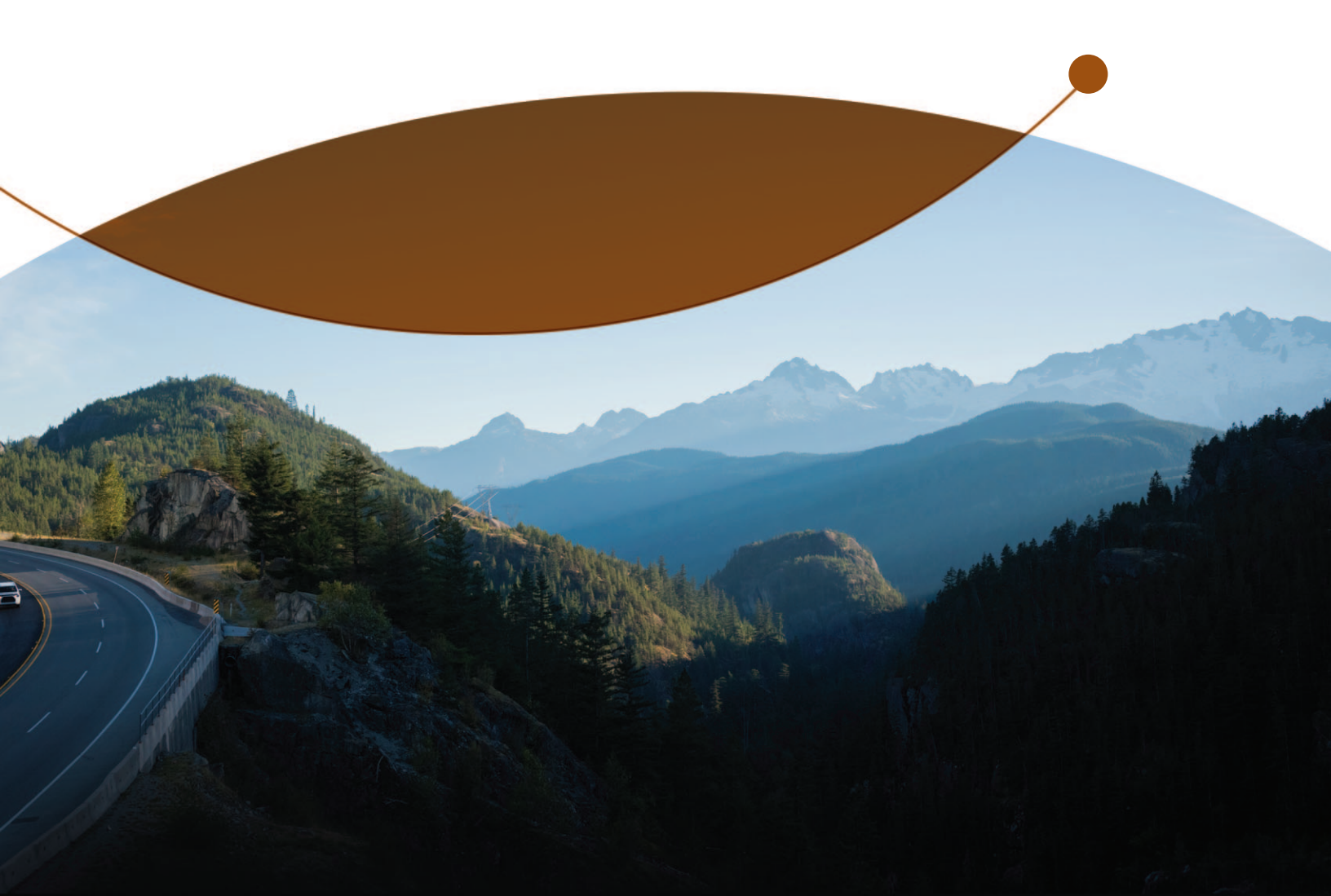

"To use AI, or not to use AI. That is the question.

Whether it is wiser to bear the risks of early adoption, and by bold action gain progress and performance indicators,

or to move with assessed care, placing the public good before all else,

thereby preventing what unknown power, once loosed, cannot be recalled."

Like Shakespeare's timeless questions, AI does not have to be over your head to be top of mind. Artificial Intelligence is often described as complex or theoretical, yet understanding it does not require technical expertise. What leaders need most are practical examples that clarify what AI is today, what it is not, and where it is already influencing local government operations.

As AI becomes increasingly embedded in the tools municipalities use every day, leaders across Canada are weighing when it is appropriate to move forward and when a more cautious approach is warranted. This interactive and approachable session is designed to help local government leaders understand how AI can be used responsibly to support operations, service delivery, and decision-making.

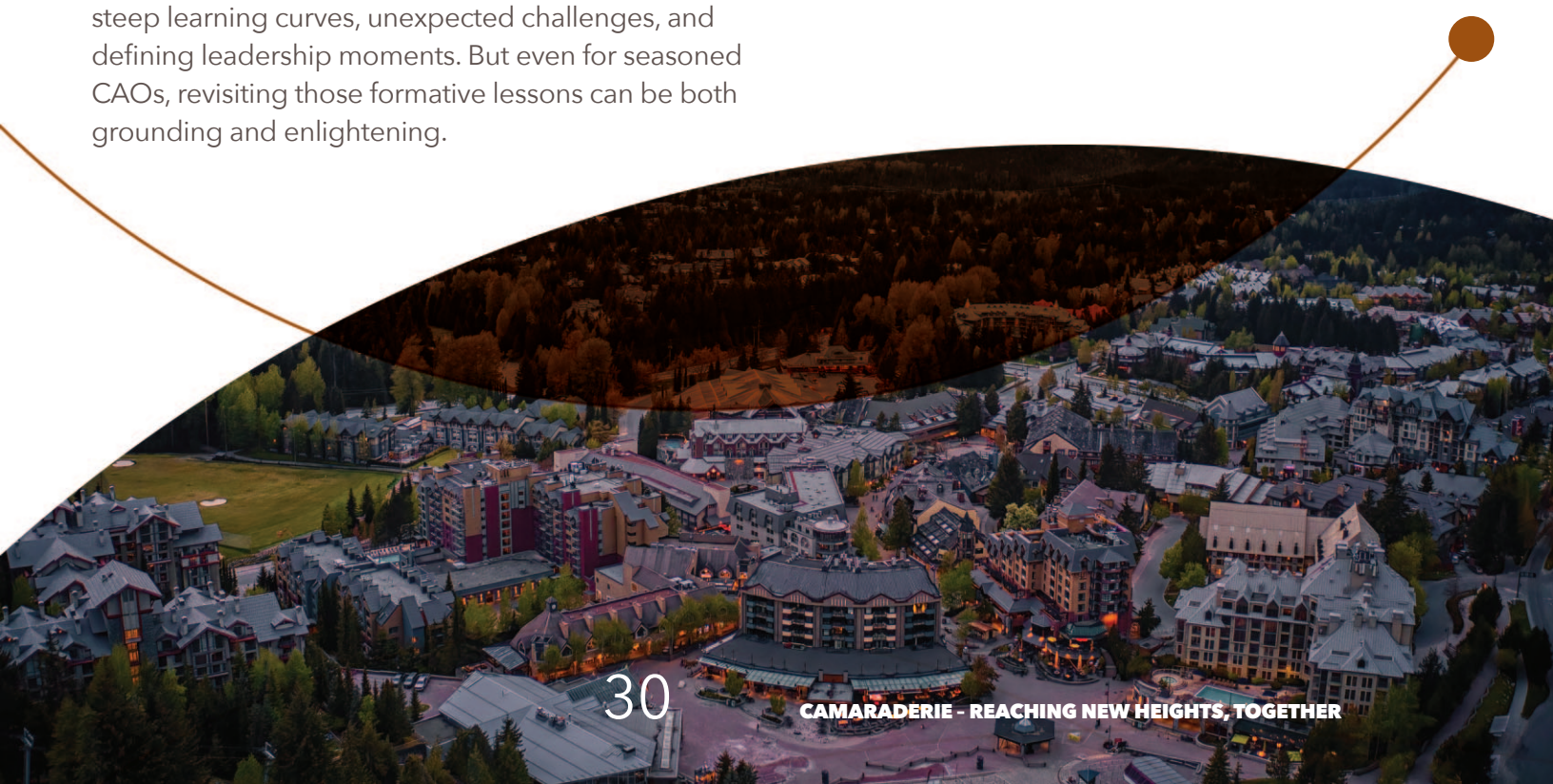
