

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A Never Ending Age of Austerity!

The financial future for local government in the UK looks bleak

➤ and will only be sustainable with more powers to generate income and to innovate locally!







2010-15 Key facts

- 37% real terms reduction on government funding to local authorities
- 25% estimated real terms reduction in local authorities income
- Largest local authority real terms budget reduction was 40%








A big shift in councils' funding

100% business rates retention culmination of big shift back from central to local funding of councils



National policy


- Smaller state 36% GDP
- Local services paid for by local taxation
- Recognition that more money is needed in adult social care, if local areas can pay
- Local government seen as enabler of private sector housing supply, skills and infrastructure

The majority of UK senior council managers (51%) remain positive about the future of the sector


➤ and most think that the role of councils will grow. But we need to become 21st C public servants

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Creating the Smaller State

Financial Sustainability/self-sufficiency (50%)

> Stimulating Economic Growth (45%)

Cost reductions/efficiency savings (40%)







The Top 3 Innovation Activities up to 2025 to become sustainable

- Income generation (and pooled budgets)-75%
- ➤ Improving Asset Management-71%
- ➤ Radical Service Redesign (digital innovation and demand management)-67%

(Intelligent Commissioning and Outsourcing seen as low priorities)!



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
