

Roger Brown has a storied and impressive career in policing, with almost four decades of experience. After a brief retirement, Chief Brown currently serves at the helm of the Fredericton Police Force. Chief Brown previously held rank of Assistant Commissioner of the RCMP in New Brunswick, and it was during that time that he had to deal with several major issues, including the shale gas protests near Rexton, the murders of three members of the Codiac detachment in Moncton, and the public PTSD struggles and suicide of a member. Chief Brown took the reins at Fredericton Police almost a year after that department lost two officers in a tragic shooting. Chief Brown now speaks around the country about mental health issues: seeking psychological help, PTSD, and the stigma around mental illness. He shares his own story in the hopes of empowering others to seek help, and to help others.

## About the speaker

Roger L. Brown Police Chief City of Fredericton

Chief Brown joined the RCMP in 1980. Following training, he worked general duties in Rivière-du-Loup, Quebec and later in Grand Bank, Newfoundland and Labrador. He served the Force in a variety of roles, including general duty, drug enforcement, federal enforcement and as an instructor at Depot in Regina. He then went on to become a Commissioned Officer at National Headquarters in Ottawa, serving in various positions, including the Officer in Charge of the Executive/Diplomatic Protection Section, the Director of Protective Policing at the national level and as the Human Resource Officer for central Canada, including National Headquarters. In 2008, he became the Commanding Officer of the RCMP Academy (Depot Division) until his transfer to New Brunswick in 2013, where he became the 29th Commanding Officer of the RCMP in New Brunswick (J Division). On June 4th, 2016, after a distinguished 36 year career, then Assistant Commissioner Brown retired from the RCMP. On June 11, 2019, Roger Brown donned a different uniform and became the Police Chief of the Fredericton Police Force.

In 2018, Chief Brown was named as one of 150 Difference Makers in Mental Health in Canada by the Canadian Centre of Addiction and Mental Health.
