What do I need to know to apply?

Academic Requirements

- Five years full-time work experience related to public policy or public management.
- Candidates should hold a four-year undergraduate degree (or its equivalent), with a minimum B+ (3.3 GPA) average standing in the last two years of study, or other evidence of strong academic potential through post-degree study or superior GRE/GMAT score.
- Applicants with significant, relevant employment experience, with a bachelor's degree of less than four years, or equivalent will be considered on a case by case basis.

Additional Requirements

- Online application, which includes a Statement of Interest.
- Two copies of official transcripts from post-secondary institutions previously attended, showing academic records from all undergraduate and graduate programs and specifying the courses taken, final grades, and standing obtained.
- Two professional recommendations. Additional academic recommendations may be submitted by email.

Key Dates and Deadlines

- Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis beginning May 1
- Notification of acceptance: No later than August 1

What is the tuition fee for the PMPA program?

Professional MPA students pay tuition fees for each course in which they enroll. Fees are due at the time of registration and may be paid in full at the beginning of the term or by monthly bank debit. A modest student assistance levy is also assessed each term.
